

#### Your Health Matters

It's that time of year when the normal bugs and viruses are in full flow, alongside the re-emergence of Covid. Please be extra vigilant and monitor whether your child is well enough to be in school. If your child tests positive for Covid, please inform us immediately so that we can track cases in school. The guidance states that children who test positive should be absent for 3 days, starting after the day that the test was taken. If you cannot test, the guidance asks for infected people to stay at home if your child has a high temperature and feels unwell. Children may return to school when they feel better and do not have a high temperature.



### **Vomiting and Diarrhoea**

Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not vomited or had diarrhoea for at leave 2 days (48 hours).

Message from Sam Maud - The White Rose Federation Pastoral team worked hard over an 18-month period to achieve the 'Wellbeing Award

Last week our children kick-started their musical journey by participating in an instrument demonstration and workshop with a team of musicians from North Yorkshire Music Service. During this demonstration, they witnessed the following instruments being played:

- · Strings: Violin, Viola, Cello
- · Woodwind: Flute, Clarinet, Saxophone, Oboe & Bassoon
- · Brass: Trumpet, Cornet, French Horn, Tenor Horn, Trombone, Euphonium
- · Piano, Keyboard · Voice





















As a Music Service, they offer lessons on the above instruments as well as percussion, drums, guitar, double bass, oboe, bassoon, cornet, French horn and tuba. If your child is interested in continuing their musical journey by beginning lessons on any musical instrument, please complete the slip below and return it to school. One of their team will then be in touch. If you have previously applied for lessons with the Music Service and are yet to receive a response, please do apply again.

The fees for instrumental and vocal tuition are as follows <u>per term</u>: Standard Group Lesson £80, Individual Tuition – 20 Minutes £156.30, Individual Tuition – 30 Minutes £219.50

Selby Music Centre is offering a **free** half term of music lessons on clarinets, recorders, saxophones, flutes, trumpets, trombones, violins, cellos, guitars and ukuleles, suitable for complete beginners or those that have been learning for a few months. We can lend you an instrument, if needed. We also have a fantastic youth choir for age 6 and upwards and other opportunities for more experienced musicians. Sessions are fun, friendly and held on Saturday mornings, starting September 16<sup>th</sup>.

Selby Music Centre is run by North Yorkshire Music Service and has some great opportunities for primary school aged musicians. We are based at Selby High School on **Saturday mornings** in term time, and we can offer a **FREE** half term of taster sessions, <u>plus</u> the loan of an instrument if needed. We are offering free lessons on **WIND** and **BRASS** instruments this half term! Don't miss this opportunity to learn a new skill!

<u>9.30 – 10.45</u> - **Strings** (violin, viola, cello, bass) and keyboards; **guitar and ukulele** group; NEW **woodwind** (clarinets, recorders, saxophone, flutes) and NEW **brass** (trumpet, cornet, trombone etc)

These groups are suitable for complete beginners, children who have been learning instruments in class at school and more able players up to approx. grade 2 standard.

<u>11.05 – 12.20</u> - Selby Youth Choir - open to all who enjoy singing age 6 upwards; senior strings (grade 2-5); folk/rock group for guitars who can strum a few chords and more able players on acoustic or electric plus strings and wind players.

All the sessions are friendly and fun, and the children experience a range of music styles and develop their skills and confidence performing in a group.
