Anti-Bullying Week – 13th – 17th November

Anti-Bullying Week is an annual event that aims to raise awareness of bullying of young people, with an emphasis on prevention and effective responses to bullying. To support Anti-Bullying Week, our children had an assembly which focused on what bullying is, how and who to report it to at school and at home. They also discussed how to ensure that they are always kind, treat each other with respect and celebrate their differences.

The children in Class 2 discussed bullying during their Jigsaw session and wrote poems (see below) and the children in Class 3 discussed how to be kind to each other during their Spirituality lesson.

On Friday, 27th November 2023 the children at fully embraced Children in Need. A Spotty, Stripy, Pudsey themed non-uniform day raised £84.11 for this important charity event. At lunchtime, our Cook Miss Franks made a Pudsey Bear cake for the children and all classes took part in traditional Pudsey colouring and biscuit decorating activities. One of our Year 5 pupils, Ella, made cookies at home and sold them to her neighbours, raising £13.11 which was added to our school fundraising total.

Children In Need is a traditional date in our school calendar which the children embrace fully. As well as contributing towards the fund, the children are aware of the importance of this event in helping to fund grassroots organisations and project workers in the UK, to support the children who need it the most. <u>Great Fire of London – Thursday, 9th November</u>

It is no coincidence that following on from the topic 'People Who Help Us' that Class 1 enhanced their Year 1 studies about the Great Fire of London when they be joined Chapel Haddlesey School to attend a workshop provided by Alfresco Learning. The begin by investigating the wattle and daub building method used to build houses in 1666. They then worked collaboratively to build their own wattle walls using sticks and then finish them off by hand with their own sticky daub mixture!

Once our structures are built we reflected on the weather prior to The Great Fire of London and discussed how this, combined with the materials, will have impacted the strength of the flames! Next the children experienced fun and movement with our very own Great Fire of London games. Finally we will took a closer look at Thomas Farriner, his bakery and that fateful night when he failed to put out the flames of his oven. We then took pity on Thomas Farriner and agreed to build him a new model bakery! For this part of the workshop children investigated different materials and aimed to build a bakery that was strong & waterproof to help Thomas Farriner get back to baking his bread!
