Afterschool Clubs

We are looking at our range of Afterschool Clubs and will advise by letter (via ScholarPack) before the end of term which clubs will be available from January, as some Clubs will change. The Clubs which will remain the same in January are Young Voices Club on a Monday, Sports Club on a Tuesday and Cooking Club on a Thursday. All of these Clubs plus any additional ones will be advised in the letter and will be available to book via ParentPay, or by emailing Mrs Briggs, if your child is attending a Club, then Kids' Corner afterwards. Please note that all of our Afterschool Clubs end at 4.30pm promptly, so we urge parents to be on time to collect their children please. Thank you.



Please Refrain From.....

Performing U-turns anywhere near school and especially in the Car Park entrance and anywhere outside the front of school, at the beginning or the end of the school day. Our children and families deserve to be kept safe and such manoeuvres will not save time if anyone is injured in the process. Some of our children in Year 5 and 6 walk to and from school alone and need to be able to cross as safely as possible and avoid as many hazards from vehicles as possible. Late Arrivals

Please be aware that the Pedestrian Gate is open from 8.45am until 9.00am daily which is plenty of time for parents to ensure that their children arrive to school on time, taking into consideration any mitigating circumstances such as traffic or weather! Children are expected to arrive in school on time the same as our staff are expected to arrive on time for work, or parents are expected to arrive to work on time themselves. The Pedestrian Gate is promptly closed at 9.00am and parents MUST sign their children into the Late Book after this time, regardless of the reason. From after 9.00am until 9.10am children are marked as Late and after 9.10am children are marked as U for Unauthorised Absence (which counts as a morning session of absence affecting the pupil's attendance percentage), as per DfE guidance. If your child is ill or absent for another reason, or you know that they are going to be later than 9.00am then please either ring the school to leave a message on the answerphone, or email admin.barlow@wrfed.co.uk to advise the reason, so that your child can be given the appropriate mark in the register. Some parents are not always happy when asked to sign their children into the Late Book but please remember, our staff are carrying out the duties they have been contracted to do under the Local Authority, following our policies. Thank you for your cooperation and for treating our staff with due respect.

Please note that if the school needs to close because of severe weather or in case of an emergency, parents will be sent a text, as soon as possible to advise the full details.

Food Policy Reminder

Food Policy Please refer to our Food Policy [MODEL SCHOOL FOOD POLICY \(barlowschool.org.uk\)](#) and in particular to the extract below: -

Water Fresh, chilled drinking water is available for all pupils throughout the day and pupils will be encouraged to drink water at frequent intervals. All packed lunch pupils have access to water at lunch time meaning there is no need for an additional drink to be brought as part of a packed lunch. Pupils are encouraged to bring a water bottle every day that they can refill as necessary. Bottles go home at the end of every day to be washed and returned. **No drinks other than water will be brought into school by pupils unless recommended by a doctor for medical needs, if this is the case for your child, please provide a Doctor's Note to advise.**



Please refrain from adding ANY medications to your child's water, unless the necessary Medicine Form has been completed and handed to your child's class teacher, along with the water bottle.



Break time snacks

The School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme (SFVS) provides a free piece of fruit or vegetable to every 4- to 6-year-old attending a state-funded school. We usually receive enough fruit to be able to offer this to all our Nursery children too. Pupils in other year groups can bring in a healthy snack for morning breaktime. This can be a piece of fruit or vegetable, or a plain rice cake. Children eating these snacks outside must stand still whilst eating them to reduce the risk of choking.

Change of Dinner Menu – Tuesday, 9th January 2024

When we return to school on the **Tuesday, 9th January** the menu will be Week 2 and the school dinner will be Pizza instead of Cottage Pie (jacket potato and panini options are still available). Please don't forget to email Mrs Briggs to advise if you need to change your child's menu on this day. For the rest of this week the menu will remain as printed. Thank you.




Class Christmas Parties

After an initial introduction led by a real-life Viking, as can be seen below the children were taken to the settlement to meet the rest of the community, to prove to the Lord or Lady of the village that they have the necessary skills to be an asset!

Working in groups the children learnt about farming and food in the Viking age, pottery, and household tasks. They had to take their turns on guard duty and learn how to defend the village from attack.
