We hope that you had a lovely half-term break and that the children are rested, ready for the exciting and busy run up to Easter. Spring has truly sprung and we have an awful lot planned in and out of school, so please avoid 'FOMO' (Fear of missing out!) and refer to this newsletter and to the calendar on the back page of this newsletter as a reminder not to miss anything! The weather is still unpredictable, so please continue to send your children to school with coats, hats, scarves and gloves, as they need be sent out to play outdoors during playtimes and lunchtimes, to have a well-earned break from their studies.



Polite Parking Reminder



As we had a visit from Keir Mather MP recently, we learnt what he had to offer our children in school when he was invited to talk to our children about the main issues that affect them, one of them being speeding. Please read the article further below to hear how the children posed questions for Mr Mather.

Leading on from speeding, it is noted that we still have parents and carers (so please share the newsletter with friends and family members so that they are

aware) who try to park as near to the parking cones as possible and as a result, run them over! We know that this happens, by the number of parents who call into the office regularly to report that they have seen parents and carers do this. Take a look at the cones yourself and see how they are damaged. This is NOT acceptable and more conscious care should be taken when parking please. As you are all are aware the parking cones are placed at the front of school and near the Car Park to help our older children (who cross alone) and families cross the road safely with a clear view of the road and approaching vehicles. The cones are there to be avoided, so please park AS FAR AWAY FROM THEM AS POSSIBLE. Please bear this mind the next time that you park near to the cones that they are expensive to replace – a child's life, on the other hand, is priceless.

We kindly request that parents, carers and staff use their judgement and common courtesy when parking in the public roads near to our school. Please respect residents and avoid blocking driveways, also avoiding blocking resident's cars in, if they are parked outside their properties, so that they are able to drive away, as required.



Peace, Friendship and Endurance

If you are parking along a narrow road, where parking wholly on the road would stop other cars, and particularly emergency vehicles, from getting through, then it is a sensible option to park elsewhere and providing you are not blocking a wheelchair user or pram/pushchair from using the pavement.

According to the RAC, it is perfectly legal to park outside someone's house, unless the vehicle is blocking a driveway, or a wheel is over a dropped kerb. Where no parking controls exist, drivers do not have an 'automatic spot' for parking outside their homes.

If your vehicle is on your driveway and another car is parked on a public highway and blocking your access out of your driveway, the council has the power to act.

Please take advantage of this opportunity and book your meetings, as soon as possible, on a first-come, first-served basis.

SchoolCloud allows you to choose your own appointment times with teachers and you will receive an email confirming your appointments. The booking window will close on Friday, 1st March at 12.00pm. Should you wish to make any changes after this date, or encounter any booking problems, please contact the school office. Either parent can book an appointment and for our families with separated parents, there is the option for both to make an individual appointment. 




Mother's and Other's Day – Wednesday, 6th March


World Book Day – Thursday, 7th March

We invite our children to dress for the day as their favourite book characters for World Book Day which will be celebrated in school. Please ensure that the costumes and footwear are suitable for the school day. All of the children will receive a Book Token. We cannot emphasise strongly enough how important it is for children to read regularly, so that they improve their language skills, learn new vocabulary, strengthening their problem-solving skills, giving them the best chance of success in every lesson.

Please remember to sign your child's Reading Record regularly and to make full use of our Bug Club platform, letting Mrs Briggs know if you are not able to log on. Please note, Year 5 and 6 children are taking part in a Football Tournament at Sherburn High School in the afternoon on this day, so may dress for World Book Day and bring their PE kits to change into.

Please remember, as previously advised, there is a change to menu on this day and instead of minced beef bolognaise the main dinner will be cheese pinwheels, new potatoes, vegetables, beans and a special World Book Day cake or jam tarts. On Wednesday, 21st February, 36 children from across The White Rose Federation joined over 5000 participants to attend the Young Voices concert at Sheffield Arena, following weeks of preparation at their individual schools with their dedicated Young Voices Club Leaders. The children were both nervous and excited to get on the coach, to be taken to their destination at Sheffield Arena, along with thousands of other enthusiastic choristers from around the country. Upon arrival the children were greeted by the Lead

Conductor, David Lawrence and his band to begin rehearsals before the big show. As the children performed their nerves were calmed as they sang to pop hits and numbers from Disney musicals and danced along with the beat of the music in fine form in front of a capacity audience. They were joined for the show by various artists and performers, including headliner Nandi Bushell, a 13-yearold drumming sensation, MC Grammar and Urban Strides.

The children arrived home around 11 hours after their initial departure from school and were still buzzing with the excitement of the day when they arrived home.



Keir Mather - Selby and Ainsty MP visit – Thursday, 8th February

We were lucky enough invite our local MP Kier Mather 'The Baby of the House' to join us in Class 3 and he accepted the invitation willingly! Whilst he was with us, Kier took a tour of the school to meet our children, then spoke to the children in Class 3 about why he became an MP, the best bits about his job and the challenges of the role. The children then put some very challenging questions to Kier, asking what he planned to do for our local area and what his impact had already been in the time he had been in office.

Finally, our School Ambassadors put forward a proposal to Kier, showing pictures they had taken of the road outside of school, highlighting the issues with speeding cars and parking. Our Ambassadors put forward that a 20mph zone would be helpful to be added to the road directly outside the school, a zebra crossing could be put in to help children cross safely, or speed bumps could be added in the village, especially near the school. Kier was very grateful for the ideas presented to him and impressed at how much work the children put into thinking about the issues that are very important to them. He took the project away to action with the promise of a video to be sent to school, to show him discussing the children's ideas in Parliament.
