Story - Jesus is our Shepherd

Today we're thinking about Jesus being our Shepherd. One of the famous places in the Bible where God is described as a Shepherd is Psalm 23, and Jesus uses the images from this psalm to describe himself as a Shepherd in chapter10 of John's gospel.

Psalms are songs written to worship God. They often tell us about who God is, and also about the writers' experiences of God. There are happy psalms, sad psalms, angry psalms and joyful psalms. They express all sorts of emotions, and show us that however we are feeling we can tell God about it as we worship him. Psalm 23 (Good News Translation)

The Lord is my shepherd;

I have everything I need.

²He lets me rest in fields of green grass and leads me to quiet pools of fresh water.

³ He gives me new strength.

He guides me in the right paths, as he has promised.

⁴ Even if I go through the deepest darkness, I will not be afraid, Lord,

for you are with me.

Your shepherd's rod and staff protect me.

⁵ You prepare a banquet for me,

where all my enemies can see me;

you welcome me as an honored guest

and fill my cup to the brim.

⁶I know that your goodness and love will be with me all my life; and your house will be my home as long as I live.



Here are some things you might like to wonder about together

- o I wonder which part of this psalm you like best?
- o I wonder why Jesus describes himself as a Shepherd?
- I wonder if you have ever been to a wonderful place like the one described in the psalm?
- I wonder if you have ever felt like things were difficult and dark, like this writer has?
- o I wonder what this psalm tells us about what Jesus is like?

Overflowing Cup

Verse 5 of Psalm 23 talks about God filling our cup to the brim, and in lots of translations it says that the cup overflows. God gives us so many good gifts, and this craft helps us to celebrate this and thank him for them.

You will need: A cup or glass, strips of paper, glue, scissors and things to decorate.



Decorate strips of paper with words, pictures or items that represent things that you would like to thank God for. This might include people, places, natural objects, possessions-whatever you like. Glue or sellotape one end of each paper strip to the inside of the cup and let the strip 'overflow' out of the cup. When you have finished, share your creations with one another and thank God for the things he has given each of you.
