Outstanding payments on ParentPay

Please could parents and carers ensure that any outstanding ParentPay debts are cleared before Wednesday 23rd October. Across the federation, there is an agreed maximum debt per child, which is £30.00. This includes any school dinner, trip, and breakfast club payments. Within ParentPay there is the facility to pre-load your Parent account with a credit balance, in order that you can make payments for items in advance. To do this, just select the payment item and choose how much you would like to add. The cash will be debited from your bank account at that time but will sit within your ParentPay credit balance to be debited each time your child has a lunch or attends a breakfast club.

For those of you have been to one of my presentations, you will note the importance I place on protecting your home phone. Nearly 50% of all frauds reported to North Yorkshire Police, the initial contact between the fraudster and victim is via the telephone. You would not dream of going off leaving your house or car without making sure it was secure, so in this day and age why would you have a telephone that does not have call screening or call blocking functions? I am very familiar with this device and know how effective it is at blocking unwanted calls. See below for details on how to apply.
