Eva G - For her constant maturity and responsible attitude towards her learning. She is developing her own style of handwriting and the presentation of her work is consistently good. This week she has helped others when writing letters form the viewpoint of an evacuee and the children have mentioned her for a shout out. Well done, Eva!

Covid Notification Guidance

The Department for Education updated its guidance in September, removing the responsibility for schools to inform parents about a Covid outbreak in class, passing this responsibility on to NHS Test and Trace. Once a positive PCR is confirmed, Test and Trace contact the affected family to ascertain close contacts and they are then contacted directly.

Once contacted by Test and Trace, the individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with Covid, or are a close contact of someone with Covid, and any of the following apply:

- they are fully vaccinated
- they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved Covid vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Our advice to families is to vigilantly watch for signs of covid and take a PCR test should they identify signs and symptoms in themselves and their family.

Public health guidance states that if there have been 5 cases of Covid across a class within 10 days, (or 10% of the school roll), it could mean that Covid is spreading within that group of children. If this does happen, we will update parents to share that we intend to implement our covid contingency plan. This includes:

- o Encouraging the use of face masks in corridors and communal areas
- o Adapting, limiting or postponing indoor sporting events, trips, open days and performances
- o Reverting to year group / class assemblies
- o Reducing the number of classes staff work across
- o Resuming twice-weekly staff lateral flow testing (if staff have stopped).

We haven't reached this threshold yet but we will notify you if we do. Thank you for continuing to help keep our schools open and safe by responding quickly to any symptoms that you observe at home.















Please note that we are now a **NUT FREE SCHOOL**. This means that to protect the health of our students we do not allow any type of nut or nut-based products into school. This applies to ALL food prepared and cooked on our premises and to food brought into our premises in the way of packed lunches, snacks and treats. Please help to keep our school nut free by adhering to the points below which apply to pupils, staff and visitors alike: -

Rugby Club



Adam Prentis, Rugby Coach with York City Knights Foundation has been delighted to return to our school and have the opportunity to run a Rugby Club with Mrs Hall.

Adam advised "Our Primary Rugby League programme consists of offering staff an up-to-date range of methods to engage children in PE. We hope all children enjoyed the sessions and we're pleased to see the progress made each week. It is vital that children are given the opportunity to practise fundamental movements and have a positive experience of PE in their early years."

Mrs Hall said "The staff and children were pleased to welcome Adam into our school to coach the pupils and engage them in the basics of rugby. It was fantastic to observe the children from Class 2 and Class 3 developing their skills and 'tackling' the knowledge surrounding this popular sport. It was also very encouraging that 15 children ranging from Reception to Year 6 took the opportunity to extend their sporting abilities by joining Adam and I at our afterschool Rugby Club. Capturing Cooking Club and Class 1 Cooking Lessons

Cooking Club has taken off this half-term with Mrs Janet Smith sharing her healthy recipes with the children who eagerly attend.

They have learnt how to prepare all of their own raw ingredients whilst following a recipe with perfect timing, finishing with culinary delights such as mushroom risotto, berry crumble and sweet pepper and tomato pasta. As you can see in the photos below the children are very capable of using different utensils to prepare their raw ingredients and with Mrs Smith's expert tuition are able to do so safely. The children in Class 1 are having cookery lessons also every Friday with Mrs Smith which is diversified to cater for the ages of the children. In the last couple of weeks, the children in Class 1 held a Bake off!



Class 2 and Class 3 WW2 Progress

As you will be aware, the children in Class 2 and Class 3 are studying WW2 and delving deeper with some research, including some articles from home and creating their own air raid shelters in class.

Along with their fellow classmates, two of the girls in Class 2 have been keen to do their own research at home. Georgia (pictured) has been researching Anne Frank and has produced a beautifully written account of Anne's life. Lacey has been delving into her own family history, discovering that her Great, Great Uncle George (pictured) was conscripted for National Service at the age of 21 and her Great Grandad watched his big brother depart for France with the Durham Light Infantry during the war.



















The children have been reading *Code Name Bananas* by popular children's author David Walliams which is about a boy called Eric who tries to save his friend Gertrude the gorilla from the zoo, as bombs rain down on the city. The children have also been reading The Lion and the Unicorn by Shirley Hughes, a tale of an evacuee who is sent from London to the country and the book contains stories from real-life evacuees, taken from the Imperial War Museum.

Class 3 are pictured below with a mystery to solve! They were invited by their teacher Mrs Hugill to list what evacuees would need to take with them when leaving home and to see what items were revealed when the box was opened. Erin said "It was amazing how many things could fit into such a small box." Mary was surprised and said "It was crazy how few things the children took with them compared to what children would take now." Eva said "I was surprised that the children had a magazine and a Kit-Kat chocolate bar to take with them."



The Children of Class 3 are also reading *When the Sky Falls* by Phil Earle which is based on the true story of an evacuee who lives with a woman with no fondness for children but a love of the rundown zoo she owns and its silverback gorilla, Adonis.

Federation Cross Country
