
### Welcome

### School Photographs

We hope that you were pleased with the individual school photograph proofs that were sent home to you recently which were taken by our school photographers, Phototronics.



Please note the following instructions for payments and processing of your child's photographs:-

- On the photograph preview, please mark the package that you require and any bolt-ons, add your child's name and class in the bottom right-hand corner and the total amount of cash or cheque or card due.
- Complete the white payment slip fully. Enclose the full amount in cash (exact amount must be included), or cheque.
- **Please ensure that the cash or cheque, white payment slip and the photograph preview is enclosed and sealed in the clear plastic envelope.**
- **Return the sealed plastic envelope and contents to school with your child by no later than Monday, 19th October.**

The completed orders are normally returned to school around 2 weeks from the collection date and a text will be sent to advise you that they are on their way home to you.

School photographs are an extra service that school provides for parents and carers with no obligation to purchase. However, we do like to hear direct feedback whether positive or negative so that we can relay this back to Phototronics thus improving the service level that they provide for you. Please do not be afraid to email Mrs Briggs with your feedback, as your honest opinions are really important to us.


### Admissions to Secondary School in September 2021

## Harvest Festival



Dear Friends

The beginning of November is traditionally a time when the Church across the world gives thanks for the Christian Saints and all who have died.

Under normal circumstances we would be organising a ***Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving for All Saints Day*** this year, ***Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> November at 3pm***. At this service we would normally remember by name all those whose funerals have been held at St. Wilfrid's, Brayton or at St. Francis, Thorpe Willoughby from September 2019 until August this year, as well as those whose funeral services have been conducted at a crematorium or cemetery during this period.



It is also an opportunity to remember any loved ones who have died, whether connected to the parish or not.

Sadly, the current Covid related restrictions in place mean the service this year is not possible. However, **St Wilfrid's Church will be open from 2-4pm on 1<sup>st</sup> November**, and you would be most welcome to come and use the space for a time of quiet reflection and prayer, if you want to. There will also be the opportunity to light a candle in loving memory of any loved ones who have died.

Our prayer would be that you would find comfort and strength in this commemoration.

May you know God's blessing and peace.

**Note:** Movement around, and seating in, the church building will be subject to the usual social distancing measures, though individual households and support bubbles will be permitted to sit together.




### After School Clubs
